

1 THE COURT: Sure.

2 MR. STEWART: This was the one I was looking at.
3 It's stamped -- this is and it says April 18th and then I was
4 like, okay. And then I go back --

5 THE COURT: So it has Mr. as person --

6 MR. STEWART: And then it was -- I'm going to
7 actually following it back up. I think this is part of that
8 and Jeannette is over estate, but then I have -- in May I have
9 a letter from the Court asking Ms. Marino to serve.

10 THE COURT: Well, is it --

11 MR. STEWART: Bizarre.

12 THE COURT: Sorry to be talking about you and you're
13 not in the conversation, but I have a motion from it
14 that was filed in late April requesting that the Court appoint
15 somebody to manage the estate. And Judge Hamby saying on
16 May 15th that Jeannette Marino is appointed and set a bond, and
17 then probably by the time, the bond came into issue some time
18 had gone by. So there's a bunch of dates.

19 MR. STEWART: Yes. And this is a complete set.

20 MS. MARINO: Uh-huh.

21 THE COURT: And Judge Gordon approved the bond on
22 June 28th. I think every judge in the system dealt with this
23 at one point in time because Judge Macleod, who's out at
24 superior court, had signed a few things in here too.

25 MR. STEWART: What I have here, Your Honor, is a

1 complete set of invoices and you may want this just in case you
2 don't have it, at least you have what you have.

3 THE COURT: Okay. You know, I'm going to have --
4 just so I don't get confused, let's put a sticker on that and a
5 staple and then I won't get mixed up when I look at them.

6 Okay. Thanks. So it looks like there are more invoices by far
7 in here than are in the -- just by a quick glance -- but I can
8 certainly compare the two now that I have those.

9 MR. STEWART: All I can say about that issue is, I've
10 been in enough hearings to know when Social Security and
11 federal benefits come up, it's like, no, it's not part of the
12 estate. I've heard that so many times so I don't know what
13 people are -- I don't get paid, you know, that way so I have no
14 idea.

15 THE COURT: I assume Social Security has some say
16 over on how the money is spent and what fees are allowed out of
17 Social Security.

18 MR. STEWART: They can audit. They can audit any
19 time they want a designated payee. I was reading about this.
20 They come in sometimes and they audit when they think there's
21 fraud.

22 THE COURT: Yeah, and that's way outside of my
23 belief. I don't -- if Social Security says it's okay, I don't
24 care, but I don't tell them what to do and we don't see them in
25 our hearings unless we ask them to come in for some reason. So
