the Moore Center because under Medicaid rules the receiving facility can pay guardian — the guardian's fees. And so that's an unusual — Jeannette has done this many times in the past, it's never been an issue, but the last year there's been lots of new issues.

THE COURT: Okay.

MR. STEWART: And I don't know quite how to -- first of all, there's a few hurdles here obviously, you know, the reasonableness of the fees and things like that, Your Honor. But just kind of thinking outside the box, I do know on the accounting itself, there's other ways you can carry that money over and make it part that of the estate. Call it a contribution, something that was an inventoried if that money -- it's kind of like somebody paid for a funeral and they paid directly to the funeral parlor, you make it as a contribution and you pay it back. I don't know that's a way if the Judge -- if you decide that she should be paid all of her fees, but that is a way to include it in the estate, have her reopen it, modify it, and earmark it, and run it through so to speak.

That's what I was thinking.

THE COURT: Okay. So you're talking about the mechanics of it. I'm just looking just at the -- again, having gone now through the file --

MR. STEWART: Yes.
