

1 MR. EBY: So Attorney Kissinger handed to me --
2 handed this to me just before the hearing, and we're happy to
3 address this issue.

4 THE COURT: Yeah. I just -- it's a kind of -- just
5 to understand it, this was a case of -- it says, "terminate
6 guardianship over the person in estate." So apparently there
7 had been a guardianship over the person in estate. And you
8 were the guardian over the person in estate?

9 THE WITNESS: Yes.

10 THE COURT: And it said, Mr. became ill, who
11 was the ward and put on life support. His spouse, Ann, is
12 disabled and was unable to act. And he's made apparently a
13 miraculous recovery and didn't need a guardian.

14 THE WITNESS: Yes. He was temporarily incapacitated.

15 THE COURT: He was on life support, it says.

16 THE WITNESS: Yes. He had -- I believe he had
17 pneumonia, and that got quite severe.

18 This is a couple, a mentally retarded couple. They
19 actually grew up at Loconia State School and have been married
20 since then. And I had originally become their representative
21 payee, but they had all kinds of -- all kinds of needs. They
22 weren't served by any agency. They both worked, and
23 unfortunately, sent them into -- into poverty and wrote up --
24 wrote -- ran up a tremendous amount of debt.
